

Strengthening of security associated with the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games

From July 23 to September 5, 2021, the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games will be held at sea and waterfront areas. (Please see the reverse side for details of the venue.)

Japan Coast Guard will strengthen maritime security for the competition, so please be aware of the following points.

◎「Thorough Security Measures」

- Please ensure that each ship has safety measures in order to prevent terrorism from occurring on its own ship and in Japan.

◎「Report to Japan Coast Guard」

- Report to Japan Coast Guard (the nearest Coast Guard Radio) when you recognize any suspicious ships around the Japan or find any suspicious persons or objects on your ship or at the port of call.

◎「Always listen to international VHF CH16」

- Because Japan Coast Guard may make radio calls, always listen to international VHF CH16.

◎「Prohibited flying the drones」

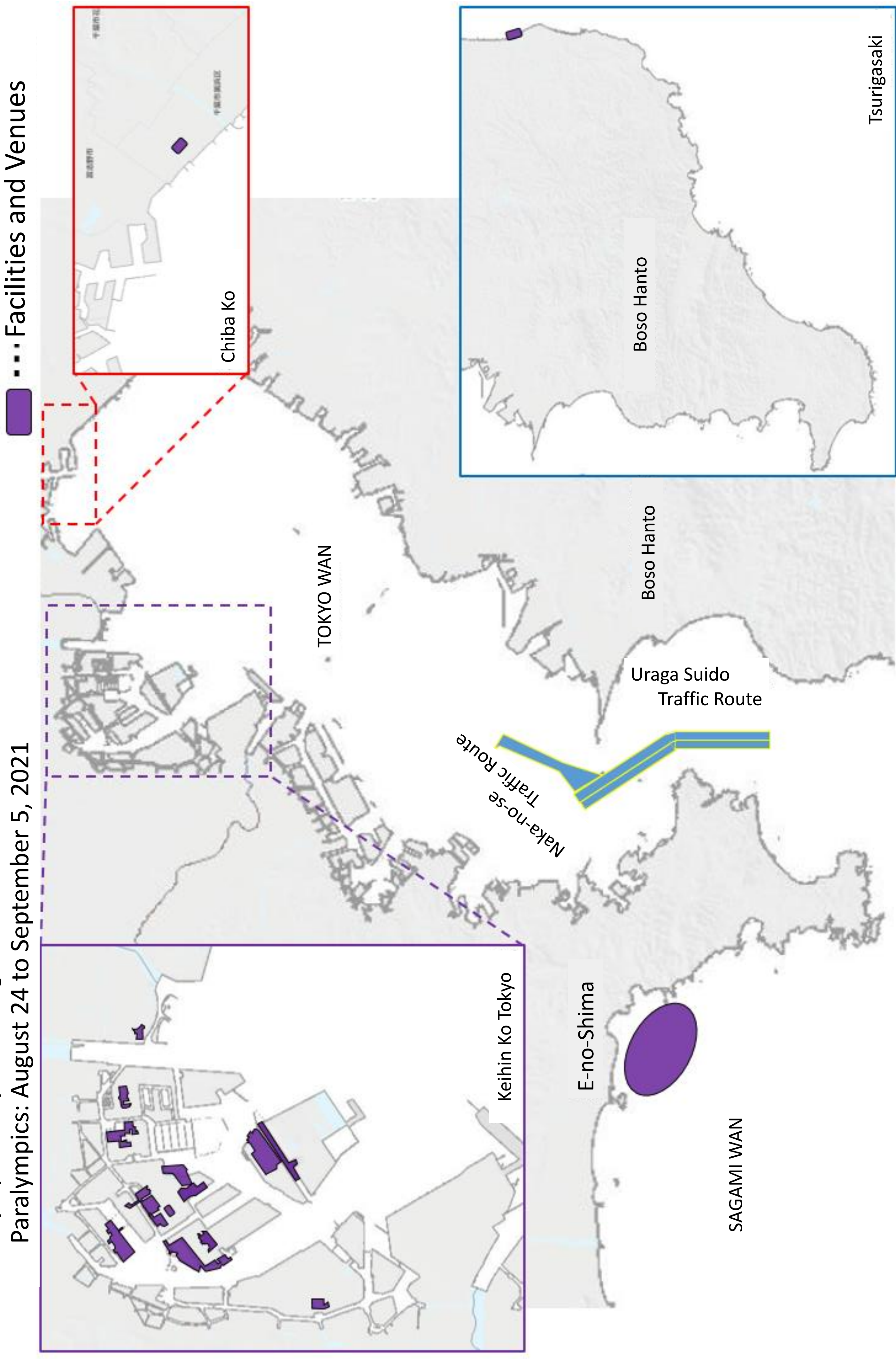
- Drones and other unmanned aircraft are not allowed to be flown without permission in the vicinities of the Olympic and Paralympic facilities.
- Besides the above facilities, there are other areas where drones are restricted, so please consult with the nearest Japan Coast Gard before flying a drone.

Facilities and venues for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games

【Period】

Olympics: July 23 to August 8, 2021

Paralympics: August 24 to September 5, 2021



「Thorough security measures」

▪ Management of entering and exiting ships

Management and recording of crews and visitors to gangway ports on ships must be thorough.

▪ Strengthening the vigilance

By conducting multiple patrols in order to increase eyes-on surveillance and strengthen warnings.

▪ Increase eyes-on surveillance and strengthen the ban.

Improve the deterrence of terrorism by surveillance in the deck area and the area around the ship, install and add surveillance cameras and post “Surveillance camera in operation” etc.

▪ Supervision of handling of cargo and stored items on board

Ensure that locks and seals are affixed to restricted areas to supervise the handling of cargo and shipboard items.

The weapons to prevent terrorism must be sealed before entering the Japanese territorial waters and placed under the control of the master to ensure thorough organization and order, and create an environment in which terrorists have difficulty operating.

▪ Thorough security education for seafarers

Making security education for seafarers so that they are not involved in terrorism or criminal acts.

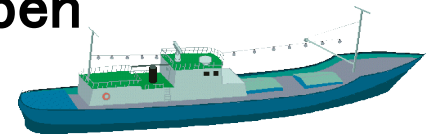
▪ Prevent illegal weapons, fire equipment, or explosives from being brought onto the ship.

Thorough baggage inspection at the port of departure in Japan and avoiding the introduction of firearms and drugs from the outside from suspicious ships, people and objects.

About examples of suspicious ships, persons, objects

Suspicious ship

- ✓ Incoming ships descended from a prize ship.
- ✓ Ships coming to land from cargo ships.
- ✓ Ships alongside each other in the open ocean.



Suspicious person

- ✓ A non-cooperating person who does not try to answer passenger's questions.
- ✓ A person who has baggage with an unusual weight in contrast to the baggage's appearance.
- ✓ A person who is talking on the phone so that others cannot hear.
- ✓ If there is a person in a place that they should not be, like stakeholder division, etc.
- ✓ A person who has no fixed point of view.



Suspicious object

- ✓ Things that are strange to be there.
- ✓ Things that a suspected suspicious person left behind intentionally.
- ✓ Items that are suspected of being dangerous and cannot be identified.



- Some are timed, remote controlled, and operate when external force is applied.
- There are cases in which dangerous substances such as sarin and other killing chemicals or bacteria have been generated in the past, and, like explosives, they may be left behind or set up as devices.
- There should be no preconceptions such as “explosives are solid” or “passenger's forgotten things”, comprehensive judgment compared to normal.
